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This notice is to inform the public that the S. C. Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) is taking public comments on a Corrective Action Plan (CAP). This CAP addresses the cleanup of soil and groundwater contamination at the facility listed below. The contamination was caused by petroleum products that were released from the underground storage tank system at this facility.

**FACILITY:** Burtons BP, 439 W Washington St., Greenville, SC

**APPLICANT:** Burtons BP, 439 W Washington St., Greenville, SC 29601

SUMMARY OF CAP: Petroleum and petroleum byproducts naturally break down over time through chemical, physical, and biological processes. These processes are called natural attenuation. Bunnell-Lammons Engineering has submitted a CAP proposing the use of the following technologies in addition to natural attenuation to clean up the contamination.

- Excavation of petroleum contaminated soils from the ground surface to a depth of 20 feet below ground surface. Soils will be hauled to a permitted landfill for proper disposal.

**PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD DEADLINE:** The **deadline** for submitting written comments is **5 PM on October 31, 2017**. Any interested person(s) may submit written comments concerning the cleanup to the Project Manager listed below. Please bring this notice to the attention of persons whom you know will be interested in this matter. Where there is a significant degree of public interest, the Agency will hold a public hearing.
