


# Colleton County Recycling Centers

## Recycle used motor oil, filters & more.

The following petroleum products **ARE ACCEPTED** and may be put into used oil collection tanks:

- motor oil;
- hydraulic fluid;
- gear oil;
- diesel fuel;
- heating oil;
- fuel oil;
- kerosene;
- automatic transmission fluid; and
- power steering fluid.

The following petroleum products **CANNOT BE PLACED** in the used oil collection tanks:

- antifreeze;
- Varsol;
- brake fluid;
- paint (oil and latex);
- paint thinner;
- refrigeration oil; and
- any solvent or substance used to clean paint brushes.

<b>ALUMINUM CANS</b>	Aluminum beverage cans and scrap aluminum	Rinse. Labels do not need to be removed. Remove from bags. Foil and pie pans ARE NOT accepted.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METAL</b>	All appliances with metal parts including stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, grills, bicycles, etc.; steel "tin" food cans; and scrap aluminum	Please ask the attendant on duty for instructions. Rinse out "tin" cans.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>BATTERIES (LEAD-ACID)</b>	Used automotive, light truck, marine and lawn mower batteries	Household batteries (alkaline batteries, Ni-Cd) ARE NOT accepted.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>CARDBOARD</b>	Corrugated cardboard (no wax finish) used for packing and shipping	Flatten.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>ELECTRONICS, HOUSEHOLD</b>	Computers, laptops, monitors, printers and televisions	Electronics are accepted from households ONLY.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>FARMER OIL</b>	Motor oil from farm equipment	Limit 55 gallons per visit.	Islandton Recycling Center
<b>NEWSPAPERS AND INSERTS</b>	Dry newspaper and inserts	DO NOT tie or bag.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>OIL BOTTLES</b>	Motor oil bottles	Drain excess oil from bottles.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>OIL FILTERS</b>	Oil filters from automobiles		All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>OIL/GASOLINE MIXTURE</b>		Transport in a tightly sealed container.	Beltline, Green Pond and Bennetts Point Recycling Centers
<b>PLASTIC BOTTLES AND JUGS</b>	Plastic bottles and jugs marked by a recycling symbol with a #1 through #7 (usually on the bottom)	Rinse	Beltline, Ruffin and Lodge Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>TIRES</b>	Automobile tires	NO oversized or off-road tires. NO rims. Limit five tires per day.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>TONER AND INKJET CARTRIDGES</b>			All Recycling Centers and Landfill
<b>USED MOTOR OIL</b>	Used motor oil from cars and trucks	Transport oil in a tightly sealed container. Limit 5 gallons per visit.	All Recycling Centers and Landfill

## Recycle used motor oil!

Used motor oil, oil filters and empty motor oil bottles should be recycled. One gallon of used motor oil poured on the ground or in a sewer system can contaminate as much as 1 million gallons of water ... often the very water we drink.

To make recycling easy and convenient, all Colleton County Recycling Centers accept used motor oil, oil filters and oil bottles for recycling.

## Why recycle?

### ■ TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES

- ❑ For each ton of recycled glass used to make new glass, nine gallons of fuel are saved.
- ❑ 58 percent less water is used to make recycled paper than when using raw materials.

### ■ TO SAVE ENERGY

- ❑ Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours.
- ❑ Two gallons of recycled motor oil have enough energy to run the average household for 24 hours.

### ■ TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE

- ❑ Landfills are expensive to build and maintain. Why put recyclables in the landfill? Save valuable landfill space.

## Recycle your electronics!

Effective July 1, 2011, S.C. residents may not knowingly place or discard a computer, computer monitor, printer or television in any waste stream that is to be disposed of in a solid waste landfill – according to recently passed legislation.
