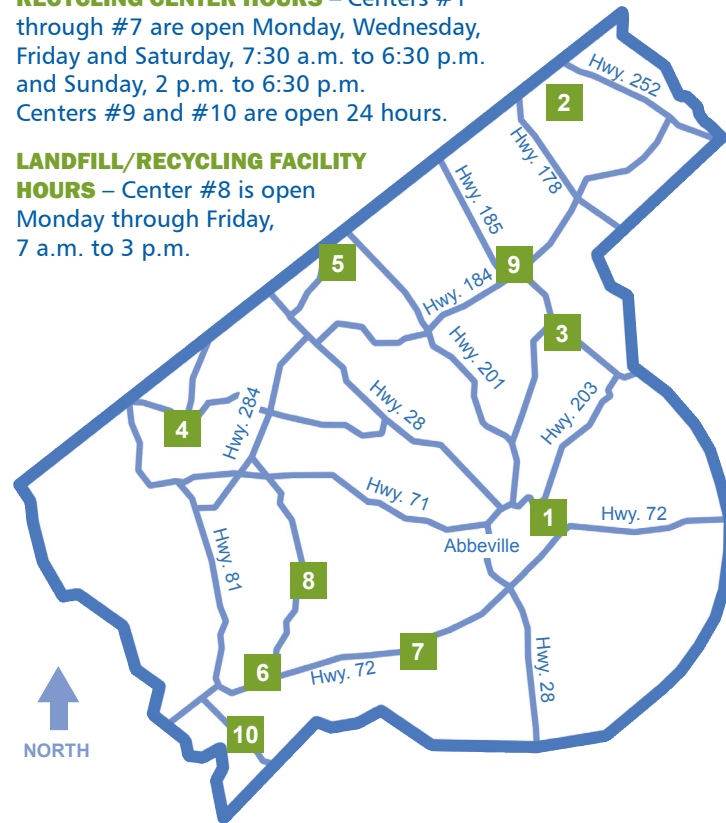


Abbeville County Recycling Centers

RECYCLING CENTER HOURS – Centers #1 through #7 are open Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday, 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. and Sunday, 2 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Centers #9 and #10 are open 24 hours.

Recycle used motor oil!

To make recycling easy, **Abbeville County Recycling Centers** (#1 through #9) accept used motor oil, oil filters and oil bottles. In addition, the Landfill Recycling Center (#8) accepts oil/gasoline mixtures.

The following petroleum products **ARE ACCEPTED** and may be put into any used oil collection tank: motor oil; hydraulic fluid; gear oil; automatic transmission fluid; and power steering fluid.

Some petroleum products **CANNOT BE PLACED** in the collection tanks including: antifreeze; Varsol; brake fluid; paint (oil and latex); paint thinner; refrigeration oil; and any solvent cleaner or substance used to clean paint brushes.

OIL/GASOLINE MIXTURES	Landfill Recycling Convenience Center ONLY
PLASTIC BOTTLES (plastic bottles marked with a #1 or #2 ONLY – usually on the bottom)	ALL Abbeville County Recycling Convenience Centers
STEEL/METAL FOOD CANS	ALL Abbeville County Recycling Convenience Centers

USED MOTOR OIL	ALL Abbeville County Recycling Convenience Centers <i>EXCEPT</i> Savannah St.

Why is recycling important?

- Recycling prevents materials from going into a landfill.
- Recycling saves money and creates jobs.
- Recycling saves natural resources like trees and petroleum.

How should items be prepared for recycling?

- Separate recyclables from your household trash.
- Rinse bottles, cans and jars.
- Flatten cardboard, aluminum cans, plastic bottles and steel cans. This will help save space.
- Keep newspaper and magazines clean and dry.
- At the recycling centers, place recyclables in the correct containers.
- When in doubt, ask!

- **It's the law to recycle electronics in South Carolina.** Household electronics are accepted at all staffed recycling centers – Centers #1 through #8. In addition, many manufacturers and retailers offer consumer recycling options.
