

# Jasper County Recycling Centers

Jasper County operates **six recycling centers** with attendants trained to assist you with recyclables and household garbage. These centers **ARE NOT FOR COMMERCIAL USE**, but are for county residents **ONLY**.

**Hours of Operation:** OPEN Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. – CLOSED Wednesday and Sunday.

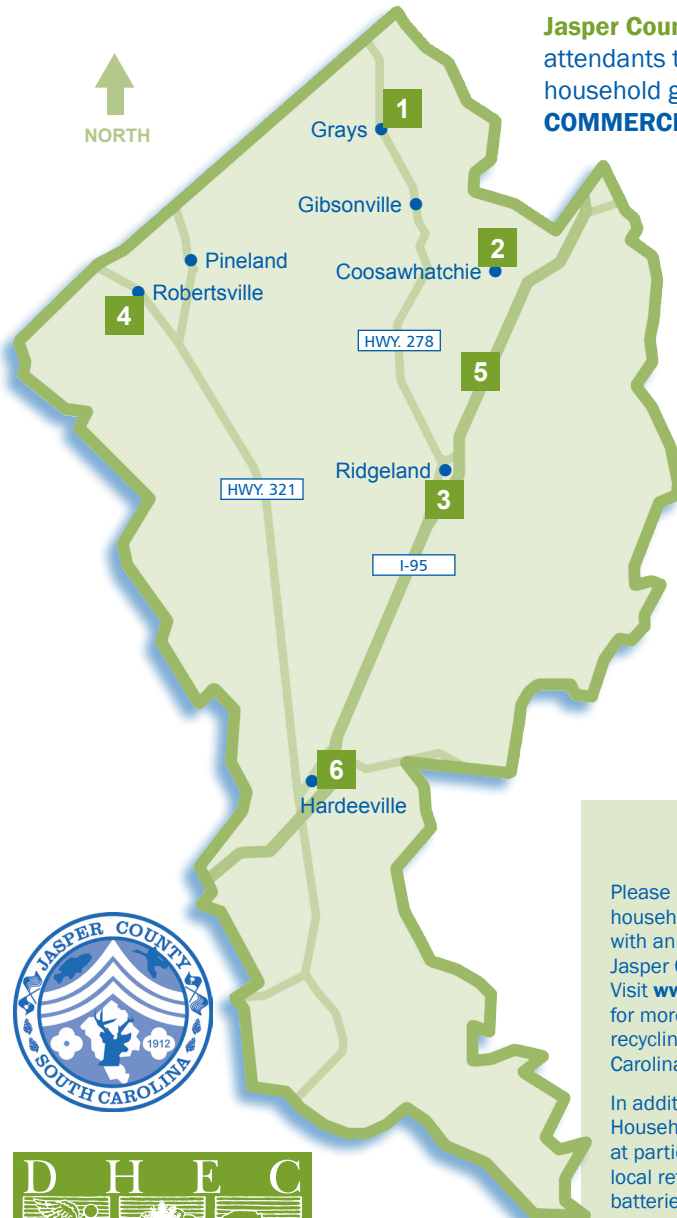

	RECYCLING CENTER ACCEPTED ITEMS	WHAT TO RECYCLE	HOW TO RECYCLE
	<b>ALUMINUM &amp; STEEL CANS</b>	Food and beverage cans, steel food cans – <b>NO foil or pie pans</b>	Rinse. Labels do not need to be removed.
	<b>ANTIFREEZE</b>	Liquid coolant from cars and trucks	See the attendant on duty for instructions. Also see “More to Know.”
	<b>APPLIANCES &amp; SCRAP METAL</b>	All appliances with metal parts including stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, grills, etc.	See the attendant on duty for instructions.
	<b>BATTERIES</b>	Lead-acid batteries from car, truck, boat and lawn mower – <b>Household batteries ARE NOT accepted.</b>	See the attendant on duty for instructions.
	<b>CARDBOARD</b>	Shipping packages and boxes – See “More to Know.”	Flatten.
	<b>CONSTRUCTION &amp; DEMOLITION DEBRIS</b>	Lumber scraps, sheet rock, shingles, wall board, plaster or other debris made during construction <b>NO treated wood</b> (e.g., railroad ties)	See the attendant on duty for instructions.
	<b>ELECTRONICS, HOUSEHOLD</b>	Desktop, laptop and notebook computers, monitors, televisions, printers – anything with a plug	For more recycling options, see the opposite side of this brochure.
	<b>GLASS</b>	Clear, green and brown glass bottles, jars and jugs – <b>NO window glass, pottery, porcelain or china</b>	Rinse. Labels do not need to be removed.
	<b>NEWSPAPER, MAGAZINES &amp; OTHER PAPER</b>	Newspaper, inserts, magazines, unwanted mail, catalogs, telephone books	Keep dry. Do not tie paper together with string or place in bags. Magazines and catalogs must be less than 1 inch thick.
	<b>MOTOR OIL, BOTTLES &amp; FILTERS</b>	Motor oil from cars and trucks – <b>limit 5 gallons per visit</b>	Transport in a tightly sealed container. See the attendant on duty for instructions. Also see “More to Know”
	<b>PLASTIC BOTTLES, JUGS AND JARS</b>	Milk jugs as well as soft drink, water and other plastic bottles with a neck – <b>NO flower pots or Styrofoam</b>	Rinse. Leave caps on.
	<b>TIRES</b>	Car, motorcycle and truck tires – <b>limit four tires per day</b>	See the attendant on duty for instructions. Also see “More to Know”

### More to Know

- **ANTIFREEZE:** DO NOT put antifreeze in any used motor oil collection tank.
- **CARDBOARD:** Cardboard with a wax finish IS NOT accepted for recycling.
- **TIRES:** Rims must be removed. Oversized tires ARE NOT accepted.
- **USED MOTOR OIL:** The following petroleum products ARE ACCEPTED and may be put into used oil collection tanks: motor oil, hydraulic fluid, gear oil, diesel fuel, fuel oil, kerosene, automatic transmission fluid and power steering fluid.

### Accepted for Disposal

The following items are accepted for disposal at all Jasper County Recycling Centers.

- **FURNITURE** (e.g., chairs, sofas, mattresses)
- **HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE**
- **YARD TRIMMINGS** (e.g., leaves, tree limbs, shrubs) NOTE: Limbs should not exceed 6 feet in length nor 6 inches in diameter. Do not mix garbage or recyclables with yard trimmings.

### Backyard Composting

Garden and landscaping debris – like leaves and yard trimmings – account for about 20 percent of waste disposed of. So it makes sense to mulch or compost it instead.

Leaves, yard and garden trimmings as well as food scraps can be turned into a valuable soil amendment – compost. Compost increases moisture retention in soil and enhances its ability to support plant growth.
