WHAT IS RECYCLING?

Recycling means making new items out of things instead of throwing them away. **It's a three-step process.** Items are first collected, usually in bins or at drop-off centers. Then, the material is broken down and made into new products. Finally, the new products are sold.

WHY SHOULD YOU RECYCLE?

Recycling saves natural resources, reduces the need for landfills and decreases pollution. Plus, many businesses in South Carolina use recyclables to make new items. (Did you know T-shirts can be made from recycled plastic bottles?) By recycling, you can help the state's economy and the environment.
