

L Darlington County Landfill Recycling Station, Transfer Station and Class 2 Landfill (2301 Great Cypress Road) – There is no fee charged to Darlington County residents for the disposal of residential garbage taken to the transfer station or for Class 2 waste taken to the landfill. Class 2 waste includes construction and demolition debris, furniture and yard trimmings. Check in at the Scale House.

HOURS: Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Saturday, 8 a.m. to noon.



Recycling/ Disposal Stations

Darlington County operates 13 recycling/disposal stations with attendants trained to help residents put recyclables and garbage in their proper place. These sites are for **RESIDENTIAL USE ONLY**.

HOURS: ALL recycling stations are OPEN Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Please note that Stations 3, 5, 8 and 12 also are OPEN on Tuesday and Thursday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. All stations are CLOSED on Sundays.

Recycle Darlington County!

Darlington County residents can recycle many materials and dispose of household garbage at 13 recycling and solid waste stations across the county as well as a municipal solid waste Transfer Station and Class 2 Landfill Recycling.

These stations are available to Darlington County residents ONLY. Anyone using the stations must be prepared to provide proof of residence in the form of a driver’s license and/or vehicle registration. Anyone who

does not have a license or vehicle registration showing residence in Darlington County should call Darlington County Environmental Services at **(843) 398-4800** to determine if they are allowed to use the stations.

REMEMBER, all loads of trash or yard trimmings **must be secured and covered by a tarp** during transit to prevent litter. For more information, contact the Litter Control Coordinator at **(843) 398-4011**. **It is illegal to burn garbage in South Carolina.**

More to Know

- **APPLIANCES:** Place metal appliances in the scrap metal bin. Doors must be removed from refrigerators and freezers. Spoiled food must be removed.
- **BATTERIES:** Household batteries (e.g., alkaline, lithium, nickel-cadmium) ARE NOT accepted for recycling.
- **CARDBOARD, CHIPBOARD, PAPERBOARD:** Please flatten. Cardboard containers with a wax or plastic coating ARE NOT accepted.
- **CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS and YARD TRIMMINGS** (e.g. wood scraps, floor coverings, leaves, tree limbs) are accepted for disposal at all centers in limited amounts.
- **ELECTRONICS:** Any household electronics with a cord can be recycled. Large electronics (e.g., console TVs) must be taken to the landfill.
- **FURNITURE** including mattresses, box springs, sofas, chairs and tables (wood and plastic) is accepted with yard trimmings.
- **GLASS:** Dishes, drinking glasses, Pyrex, mirrors and light bulbs are accepted with household garbage.
- **PAINT:** All paints must be solidified with dirt, kitty litter or quick cement and discarded with household garbage.
- **PLASTIC BOTTLES:** Plastic containers with a neck – marked with a #1 through #7 usually on the bottom – are accepted for recycling.
- **TELEPHONE BOOKS** are recycled in the commingled recycling container.
- **TEXTILES:** CLEAN, DRY clothing, shoes, belts, purses, hats, towels, household linens and blankets are collected for reuse.
- **TIRES:** Residents can bring up to four passenger tires per driver’s license each day at no charge. Beyond that, passenger tires are \$2 each and truck tires are \$100 per ton.
- **USED MOTOR OIL, FILTERS AND BOTTLES:** Limit 10 gallons of used motor oil per visit. Do not remove caps from bottles. Drain oil filters completely.

Recycling Tips

- **COMPOST!** Did you know you can compost fruit and vegetable trimmings, paper napkins and towels and more?
- **USED MOTOR OIL**, oil filters and empty oil bottles must be recycled. One gallon of used motor oil can contaminate as much as 1 million gallons of water if disposed of improperly.
- **SHOP SMART!** Buy in bulk. Buy only what you need. Buy recycled products.

It’s now the law to recycle electronics in South Carolina.

S.C. residents may not knowingly place or discard a computer, monitor, printer or television in any waste stream that is to be disposed of in a solid waste landfill. In addition to all Darlington County Recycling/Disposal Stations, household e-scrap is accepted by many manufacturers and retailers through consumer takeback programs.
