CARDBOARD, CHIPBOARD & PASTEBOARD	Corrugated cardboard (no wax finish) used for packing and shipping, cereal boxes, soda cartons, shoe boxes, etc.	Flatten.	Curbside and All Convenience Centers

ELECTRONICS (E-SCRAP)*	Computers, monitors, printers, etc. For a complete list, see below.*	E-scrap is accepted from households ONLY. For e-scrap recycling options for schools and businesses, please call (864) 942-8754.	Convenience Centers
FARMER OIL	Oil from farm equipment	Limit 55 gallons per visit.	Siloam Church Rd. (#1) Convenience Center
GASOLINE/OIL MIXTURES			Siloam Church Rd. (#1) Convenience Center
GLASS	Clear, green, brown and blue glass bottles and jars	Rinse. Window glass, pottery, porcelain and china ARE NOT accepted for disposal.	Curbside and All Convenience Centers
NEWSPAPER, MAGAZINES & OTHER PAPER	Dry newspapers, inserts, telephone books, unwanted mail, catalogs, paperback books, gift paper, magazines	Carbon paper or partially burned paper IS NOT accepted. Covers from hardback books should be removed; inside pages may be recycled.	Curbside and All Convenience Centers
PLASTIC BOTTLES & JARS	Soft drink and plastic bottles marked by a recycling symbol with a number 1-7 (usually found on the bottom), milk jugs, detergent, soap bottles	Plastic grocery bags, flower pots and Styrofoam (although they may have a recycling symbol) ARE NOT accepted.	Curbside and All Convenience Centers
TIRES		See "More to Know."	Landfill ONLY
USED MOTOR OIL, OIL BOTTLES & OIL FILTERS	Used motor oil, filters and bottles (oil must be free of gasoline or diesel fuel) and other petroleum products	Limit 5 gallons per trip. See "More to Know."	All Convenience Centers

More to Know ...

- **ANTIFREEZE: DO NOT** put antifreeze in the used motor oil collection tanks.
- **APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METALS:** Enclosed cylinders with valves are accepted. Refrigerators and air conditioners **MUST** be taken to the landfill.
- **COOKING OIL** is accepted from **HOUSEHOLDS ONLY**. Limit 5 gallons per visit
- **GLASS JARS AND BOTTLES:** Window glass, pottery, porcelain and china **ARE NOT** accepted.
- **HARDCOVER BOOKS:** Covers from hardback books must be removed. Recycle the inside pages.
- **TIRES:** Rims must be removed.
- **USED MOTOR OIL:** The following petroleum products **ARE ACCEPTED** and may be put into the used oil collection tank: motor oil, hydraulic fluid, gear oil, diesel fuel, fuel oil, kerosene, automatic transmission fluid and power steering fluid. Limit 5 gallons per visit.

* **It's now the law to recycle electronics in South Carolina.** S.C. residents may not knowingly place or discard a computer, computer monitor, printer or television in any waste stream that is to be disposed of in a solid waste landfill. Unwanted electronics (e-scrap) accepted from residents for recycling include: PCs; monitors; VCRs; radios; stereos; DVD players; microwaves; power supplies; rechargeable batteries; vacuums; banking equipment; telephones; pagers; networking equipment; laptops; keyboards; mice; power cables; medical equipment (non-hazardous); printers; copy machines; fax machines; cell phones; transformers; scanners; portable electronic devices; servers; HUBS; ink cartridges; toner cartridges; remotes; modems; projectors; and cameras. **NOTE: E-scrap is accepted from households ONLY.** For e-scrap recycling options for schools and businesses, call (864) 942-8662. In addition to all Greenwood County Convenience Centers, e-scrap is accepted by many manufacturers and retailers that also offer consumer take-back programs.
