

Marion County Environmental Services

Marion County Environmental Services provide solid waste services to the unincorporated areas of Marion County. All residences are required by ordinance to subscribe to the service. The system is designed to offer a range of services to the citizens of Marion County that will meet disposal needs in a manner that is convenient to the user and is in full compliance with state and federal requirements.

- **CURBSIDE GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICES:** Marion County contracts with Waste Management for residential waste service. Each residence is provided with a roll cart for disposal of household waste. The container is emptied weekly and should be set out by 6 a.m. on the assigned pickup day for your area. The cart should be placed by the paved or county-maintained dirt road nearest your residence. Collection trucks will not collect from private lanes.
- **MONTHLY FEES:** A monthly statement will be mailed to your address. Fees are due by the 15th of the month.
- **SERVICE COMPLAINTS OR INQUIRIES:** If you have a complaint or inquiry, call (843) 423-8234. If your roll cart is not emptied on the appropriate day, call the next morning and file a complaint. Your service problem will be given directly to Waste Management and will be resolved the following day.
- **SERVICE EXEMPTIONS:** A number of service exemptions are available. These include recreational property, migrant labor housing, commercial services and uninhabited structures. To see if your property qualifies for one of these service exemptions, call (843) 423-8234 for details.
- **RENTAL PROPERTY:** For rental properties, the county ordinance requires the fee to be the responsibility of the property owner.

Did you know?

- RECYCLING CAN SAVE YOU MONEY.** In Marion County, garbage must be hauled out of county for disposal and a per ton fee paid to the hauling company. The more that is recycled the less that needs to be landfilled. Recycling can prevent solid waste fee increases.
- RECYCLING CAN SAVE YOU TIME.** If you compost food scraps and yard trimmings at home, you will make fewer trips to the recycling center. To find out how to start composting in your backyard, visit www.scdhec.gov/compost.

More to Know ...

- CARDBOARD:** Cardboard with a wax finish IS NOT accepted for recycling.
- COMPACT FLUORESCENT BULBS:** Recycle them at participating Lowe’s and all The Home Depot stores.
- GLASS:** Window glass, pottery, porcelain and china ARE NOT accepted.
- RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES:** For a list of local retailers that accept them, visit www.rbrccom.
- TIRES:** Rims must be removed. Oversized tires ARE NOT accepted. Limit four per visit.
- USED MOTOR OIL:** The following petroleum products ARE ACCEPTED and may be put into used oil collection tanks: motor oil, hydraulic fluid, gear oil, diesel fuel, fuel oil, kerosene, automatic transmission fluid and power steering fluid. Limit 5 gallons per visit.
