- III. **FACTS:** For the periods November 1, 2010 through November 30, 2010, EQC issued fifty (50) Consent Orders with total assessed civil penalties in the amount of \$54,433.25. Four (4) Administrative Orders were also reported during this period with total assessed civil penalties in the amount of \$7,400.00.

Unless otherwise specified, "Previous Orders" as listed in this report include orders issued by Environmental Quality Control programs within the last five (5) years.

ANALYSIS: During the reporting period, Drinking Water Enforcement issued thirty-five (35) Consent Orders to various respondents. Of those 35 Orders, twenty-seven (27) were for failure to submit its standard monitoring plan or system specific study and Initial Distribution System Evaluation (IDSE) report, which is a violation of the State Primary Drinking Water Regulations. All civil penalties were stipulated for the 27 Orders.

Water Pollution Enforcement entered into two (2) Consent Orders with Richland County Department of Utilities (Respondent). One Order was for violations at the Eastover Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF). Violations include failure to comply with the effluent limits for biochemical oxygen demand percent removal, total suspended solids, and total suspend solids percent removal as contained in its National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit. A new WWTF must be constructed at the Eastover Site and a civil penalty was assessed in the amount of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00). A suspended civil penalty was also assessed in the amount of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) and will be due if the Respondent fails to meet the requirements of the Order. The second Order was for violations at the Broad River WWTF. Violations include failure to comply with the effluent limits for total phosphorous and fecal coliform as contained in its National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit. Improvements must be made to the Broad River WWTF and a civil penalty was assessed in the amount of two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$2,800.00). A suspended civil penalty was also assessed in the amount of four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) and will be due if the Respondent fails to meet the requirements of the Order.

Food Protection Enforcement entered into three (3) Administrative Orders with three (3) food establishments for various violations. Total civil penalties were assessed in the amount of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.00).
