I. TITLE: Administrative Orders, Consent Orders, and Sanction Letters issued by HEALTH

REGULATION (HR).

II. SUBJECT: Sanctions completed during the period June 1, 2007, through June 30, 2007.

III. FACT: For the period June 1, 2007, through June 30, 2007, Health Regulation issued one (1) license suspension and two (2) Consent Orders with total penalties of \$8,210.

IV. ANALYSIS: 1. Mary Black Memorial Hospital, 1700 Skylyn Drive, Spartanburg, SC 29304. Under a Consent Order dated June 21, 2007, the facility paid a penalty of \$6,210. The facility was found to have violated R.61-15, Certification of Need for Health Facilities and Services for failure to seek a determination from the Department regarding a substantial change and/or an additional approval of a Certification of Need.

<u>Previous Sanctions:</u> The facility was issued a Sanction Letter for perinatal violations and paid a \$2000 fine in October, 2004.

2. <u>McLeod Regional Medical Center</u>, 555 E. Cheves Street, Florence, SC 29501. Under a Consent Order dated April 24, 2007, the facility paid a penalty of \$2,000. The facility was found to have violated R.61-63, <u>Radioactive Materials</u> for failure to follow operating procedures pertaining to performing pregnancy tests prior to administering a radioisotope.

Previous Sanctions: None.

3. <u>Davile LTD at Giants Beachwear, 1700 South Ocean Blvd., North Myrtle Beach, SC 29582</u>. On June 1, 2007, the Department issued a letter to suspend the facility's permit; however, on June 25, 2007, the Department lifted the suspension because the facility complied satisfactorily. The facility was found to have violated R.61-109, <u>Standards for Licensing Body Piercing Facilities</u>. Violations included missing documentation for the following: a staff member's personnel file; staff member's training for CPR, infection control, and first aid; and informing clients of the AABB
