

Why recycle?

■ TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES

- Fifty-eight percent less water is used to make recycled paper than when using raw materials.

■ TO SAVE ENERGY

- Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours.
- Two gallons of recycled motor oil have enough energy to run the average household for 24 hours.

■ TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE

- Landfills are expensive to build and maintain. Why put recyclables in the landfill? Save valuable landfill space.



ITEMS TO RECYCLE	WHAT TO RECYCLE	HOW TO RECYCLE	WHERE TO RECYCLE
ALUMINUM CANS	Aluminum beverage cans	Rinse. Remove from bags. Foil and pie pans ARE NOT accepted.	All Recycling Centers
APPLIANCES	All appliances with metal parts including stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, etc.	Please ask the attendant on duty for instructions.	All Recycling Centers
BATTERIES (LEAD-ACID)	Used automotive, light truck, marine and lawn mower batteries	Household batteries (alkaline batteries, Ni-Cd) ARE NOT accepted.	All Recycling Centers
FARMER OIL	Motor oil from farm equipment		Ashland-Stokes and Ashwood Recycling Centers ONLY
NEWSPAPER, INSERTS AND OFFICE PAPER	Newspapers, inserts, unwanted mail, office paper	Do not tie or bag newspapers. Keep dry.	All Recycling Centers
OIL/GASOLINE MIXTURES	Oil and gasoline mixtures from lawn equipment, etc.	Limit 5 gallons per visit.	Ashwood and Calvary Recycling Centers ONLY
OIL BOTTLES	Motor oil bottles	Drain excess oil from bottles.	All Recycling Centers
OIL FILTERS	Oil filters from automobiles		All Recycling Centers
PLASTIC BOTTLES, JARS AND JUGS	Plastic bottles, jars and jugs marked with a #1 or #2 (usually found on the bottom)	Remove caps and lids. Rinse. Labels DO NOT need to be removed.	All Recycling Centers
SCRAP METAL AND STEEL CANS	Steel "tin" food cans and scrap metal including grills, bicycles, etc.	Please ask the attendant on duty for instructions. Rinse out "tin" cans.	All Recycling Centers
TIRES	Automobile tires	NO oversized or off-road tires. Limit four tires per visit.	All Recycling Centers
USED MOTOR OIL	Used motor oil from cars and trucks	Transport oil in a tightly sealed container. Limit 5 gallons per visit.	All Recycling Centers
YARD TRIMMINGS	Leaves, brush, tree limbs		All Recycling Centers

Recycle used motor oil!

Used motor oil, filters and bottles should be recycled. One gallon of used motor oil poured on the ground or in a sewer system can contaminate as much as 1 million gallons of water – often the very water we drink.

To make recycling easy and convenient, all Lee County Recycling Centers accept used motor oil, filters and bottles for recycling.



Backyard Composting

Garden and landscape debris, such as leaves and grass clippings, account for up to 20 percent of the waste disposed.

Obviously, it makes sense to mulch or compost. Through these processes organic trimmings can be recycled and used in landscape design and gardens.

When mixed with soil, compost increases organic content, improves the physical properties of the soil and supplies essential nutrients that enhance the soil's ability to support plant growth.
