Lexington County's Home-grown Mulch

Lexington County Solid Waste periodically has shredded wood mulch available for purchase at the Edmund Landfill by residents, businesses and municipalities. This mulch is well-suited for use around trees and gardens or along water ways, trails and erosion control areas. The cost for residents is \$10 per load. For business and municipalities, the cost is \$20 per ton. Call ahead for availability.

Why is recycling important?

- Recycling prevents materials from going into a landfill.
- Recycling saves money and creates jobs.
- Recycling saves natural resources like trees and petroleum.

How should items be prepared for recycling?

- Clean your recyclables and separate them from your regular household trash.
- Flatten cardboard, aluminum cans, plastic bottles and steel cans. This will help save space.
- Keep newspaper and magazines clean and dry.
- At the collection centers, place recyclables in the correct containers.
- When in doubt, leave it out ... or ask!
