

Marion County Environmental Services

Marion County Environmental Services provide solid waste services to the unincorporated areas of Marion County. All residences are required by ordinance to subscribe to the service. The system is designed to offer a range of services to the citizens of Marion County that will meet disposal needs in a manner that is convenient to the user and is in full compliance with state and federal requirements.

- **GARBAGE SERVICES:** Curbside Collection: Marion County contracts with Waste Management for residential waste service. Each residence is provided with a roll cart for disposal of household waste. The container is emptied weekly and should be set out by 6 a.m. on the assigned pickup day for your area. The cart should be placed by the paved or county-maintained dirt road nearest your residence. Collection trucks will not collect from private lanes.
- **MONTHLY FEES:** A monthly statement will be mailed to your address. Fees are due by the 15th of the month. Accounts falling in arrears in excess of 60 days will have a two percent penalty added.
- **SERVICE COMPLAINTS OR INQUIRIES:** Should you have a complaint or inquiry, please call our office at **(843) 423-8234**. If your roll cart is not emptied on the appropriate day, please call our office the next morning and file a complaint. Your service problem will be faxed directly to Waste Management and will be resolved the following day.
- **SERVICE EXEMPTIONS:** A number of service exemptions are available. These include recreational property, migrant labor housing, commercial services and uninhabited structures. If you feel that your property may qualify for one of these service exemptions, please call our office for details.
- **RENTAL PROPERTY:** For rental properties, the county ordinance requires the fee to be the responsibility of the property owner.



Recycling Tips

- **Recycling can save you money.** In Marion County, garbage must be hauled out of county for disposal and a per ton fee paid to the hauling company. The more that is recycled the less that needs to be landfilled. Recycling can prevent solid waste fee increases.
- **Recycling can save you time.** If you compost food scraps and yard trimmings at home, you will make fewer trips to the recycling center. To find out how to start composting in your backyard, visit www.scdhec.gov/compost.

ALUMINUM CANS	Aluminum beverage cans	Rinse. Remove from bags.	Recycling Centers 1, 2, 3 and 4
APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METAL	All appliances such as stoves, refrigerators, washers and dryers, as well as grills, bicycles, etc.	Remove glass or plastic shelves from appliances.	Recycling Centers 1 and 2
CANS, FOOD	Steel "tin" food cans	Rinse.	Recycling Centers 1, 2, 3 and 4
CARDBOARD	Corrugated cardboard (no wax finish) used for packing and shipping	Flatten.	Recycling Centers 1, 2 and 3
ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT	Computers, televisions, printers, VCRs, etc.		Recycling Centers 1 and 2
GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS	Green, brown and clear glass bottles and jars	Rinse. Discard lids and caps. Paper labels DO NOT need to be removed. Window glass, pottery, porcelain and china ARE NOT accepted for disposal.	Recycling Centers 1, 2, 3 and 4
MIXED PAPER	Office paper, copy paper, unwanted mail, etc.		Recycling Center 3
NEWSPAPERS	Dry newspapers and inserts	DO NOT tie or bag.	Recycling Centers 1, 2 and 4
OIL BOTTLES	Motor oil bottles	Drain excess oil from bottles.	Recycling Centers 1 and 2
OIL FILTERS	Oil filters from automobiles		Recycling Centers 1, 2, 3 and 4
PAPERBOARD	Packaging like cereal and shoes boxes	Flatten. Keep dry.	Recycling Centers 1 and 2
PLASTIC BOTTLES AND JARS	Plastic bottles, jars and jugs marked with a #1 or #2 usually found on the bottom	Remove caps and lids. Rinse. Labels DO NOT need to be removed. Plastic bags, film or wrap ARE NOT accepted.	Recycling Centers 1, 2, 3 and 4
TIRES	Automobile and truck tires	NO oversized or off-road tires. Limit four tires per visit.	Recycling Centers 1, 2 and 5
USED MOTOR OIL	Used motor oil from cars and trucks	Transport oil in a tightly sealed container. Limit 5 gallons per visit.	Recycling Centers 1, 2, 3 and 4
