



When are recyclables picked up?

The collection of recyclables, except yard trimmings, will take place on your regular garbage pickup day. Recyclables should be put in your recycling bin and placed beside your garbage cart. For a list of recyclables collected, see the chart on the inside of this brochure.

Residents are responsible for delivering all construction and demolition (C&D) debris to the Twin Chimneys Landfill at 11075 Augusta Road in Honea Path or another C&D debris landfill.

Need a recycling bin?

The City of Travelers Rest provides recycling bins at NO CHARGE. Call **(864) 834-9020** to request a bin. If you are moving, please return it to the City.


Recyclables collected curbside ...

ITEMS TO RECYCLE	WHAT TO RECYCLE	HOW TO RECYCLE
 ALUMINUM CANS	Aluminum beverage cans	Rinse.
 MIXED PAPER	Newspaper and inserts as well as brown paper bags, magazines, catalogs, mailers, telephone books as well as copy, notebook and computer paper	Keep dry. DO NOT place paper in your recycling bin on rainy days.
 PLASTIC BOTTLES AND JUGS	Plastic bottles and jugs with a neck (e.g., milk jugs, water jugs, detergent bottles, beverage bottles, etc.) marked with chasing arrows and a #1 or #2 on the bottom	Rinse and remove caps. Labels DO NOT need to be removed.
 WHITE GOODS (LARGE APPLIANCES)	Large appliances (e.g., washers, dryers, refrigerators, air conditioners)	Place items at the curb on the same day as your garbage pickup.
 YARD TRIMMINGS	Leaves, grass clippings, brush and tree limbs (no more than 4 feet in length or 4 inches in diameter)	Place leaves and grass clippings in bags. Place at the curb by Friday. Call (864) 834-9020 to request pickup.

Tarp your load. It's the law.

According to S.C. law, "No vehicle may be driven or moved on any public highway unless the vehicle is so constructed or loaded to prevent any of its load from dropping, sifting, leaking or otherwise escaping from the vehicle ... Trucks, trailers or other vehicles when loaded with rock, gravel, stone or other similar substances which could blow, leak, sift or drop must not be driven ... unless the load is securely covered by tarpaulin or some other suitable covering."

This applies to garbage and other materials.

Why recycle?

- **TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES**
 - 58 percent less water is used to make recycled paper than when using raw materials.
- **TO SAVE ENERGY**
 - Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours. Every ton of mixed paper recycled can save the energy equivalent of 185 gallons of gasoline.
 - Two gallons of recycled motor oil have enough energy to run the average household for 24 hours.
- **TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE**
 - Landfills are expensive to build and maintain. Why put recyclables in the landfill? Save valuable landfill space.
- **TO SAVE TAX DOLLARS**
 - The City of Travelers Rest pays landfill fees to dispose of garbage. Recycling reduces the amount of garbage going to the landfill and saves tax dollars by reducing the fees paid.
