


# Williamsburg County Recycling Centers

## Did you know?

- **WILLIAMSBURG COUNTY RECYCLING CENTERS** are for residential use only.
- **COMMERCIAL SOLID WASTE:** The use of any Williamsburg Recycling Center for the disposal of commercially generated waste is **ILLEGAL**. Centers accept household garbage **ONLY**.
- **USED MOTOR OIL:** The following petroleum products **ARE ACCEPTED** and may be put into used oil collection tanks:
  - motor oil;
  - hydraulic fluid;
  - gear oil;
  - diesel fuel;
  - fuel oil;
  - kerosene;
  - automatic transmission fluid; and
  - power steering fluid.

The following petroleum products **ARE NOT ACCEPTED** and **SHOULD NOT** be put into used oil collection tanks:

  - antifreeze;
  - brake fluid;
  - paint (oil and latex);
  - paint thinner/Varsol;
  - refrigeration oil; and
  - any solvent cleaner or substance used to clean paint brushes.

<b>ALUMINUM</b>	Aluminum beverage and food cans, foil, pie pans, scrap aluminum	Rinse beverage containers, cans and pans.	All Recycling Centers
<b>APPLIANCES (WHITE GOODS) AND SCRAP METAL</b>	All appliances with metal parts (stoves, washers, dryers, refrigerators, grills, bicycles, etc.)		All Recycling Centers
<b>BATTERIES (LEAD-ACID AND NI-CD)</b>	Used automotive, marine and lawn mower batteries as well as rechargeable batteries	NO alkaline batteries.	All Recycling Centers
<b>CARDBOARD</b>	Corrugated cardboard (no wax finish) used for packing and shipping	Empty and flatten. NO Styrofoam.	All Recycling Centers
<b>ELECTRONICS, HOUSEHOLD</b>	Desktop, laptop and notebook computers, monitors, televisions and printers and other electronics	DO NOT take apart or break.	All Recycling Centers
<b>FARMER OIL</b>	Motor oil from farm equipment	Limit 55 gallons per visit.	Public Works, Hemingway, Lane and Greeleyville Recycling Centers ONLY
<b>NEWSPAPER, MAGAZINES AND OTHER PAPER</b>	Newspapers, inserts, office paper, magazines	Do not tie or bag.	Public Works, Hemingway, Greeleyville and Mouzon Recycling Centers ONLY
<b>OIL FILTERS</b>	Oil filters from passenger vehicles		All Recycling Centers
<b>OIL/GASOLINE MIXTURES</b>			Public Works Recycling Center ONLY
<b>PLASTIC BOTTLES, JARS AND JUGS</b>	Milk jugs as well as soft drink, water and other plastic bottles and containers	Rinse.	Public Works, Hemingway and Greeleyville Recycling Centers ONLY
<b>STEEL CANS</b>	Food cans, pots, pans, etc.	Rinse.	All Recycling Centers
<b>TIRES</b>	Tires from cars and trucks	Limit four tires per day.	All Recycling Centers
<b>USED MOTOR OIL</b>	Used motor oil from passenger vehicles	Transport oil in a tightly sealed container. Oil must be free of gasoline and antifreeze.	All Recycling Centers

## Why recycle?

- **TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES**
  - For each ton of recycled glass used to make new glass, nine gallons of fuel are saved.
  - 58 percent less water is used to make recycled paper than when using raw materials.
- **TO SAVE ENERGY**
  - Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours.
  - Two gallons of recycled motor oil have enough energy to run the average household for 24 hours.
- **TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE**
  - Landfills are expensive to build and maintain. Why put recyclables in the landfill? Save valuable landfill space.

## Recycle used motor oil!

Used motor oil, oil filters and empty motor oil bottles are frequently improperly disposed of. One gallon of used motor oil poured on the ground or in a sewer system can contaminate as much as 1 million gallons of water ... often the very water we drink.

To make proper disposal easy and convenient, all Williamsburg County Recycling Centers accept used motor oil, oil filters and oil bottles for recycling.
