


Laurens County Recycling & Disposal Centers

About the Recycling & Disposal Centers ...

- These facilities are for **Laurens County residents ONLY** and are for the disposal of day-to-day household waste.
- All materials must be placed in designated containers.
- Placing or spilling materials on the ground is considered litter and is subject to **fines up to \$1,000 per violation**.
- No items may be removed from containers or the facility grounds except as directed by Laurens County for disposal or recycling.
- Sites are open to the public **during posted hours ONLY** and any material left at the gates or thrown over fences will result in fines.

Recycle used motor oil!

Used motor oil and oil filters should be recycled. To make recycling easy and convenient, all Laurens County Recycling & Disposal Centers accept used motor oil and oil filters for recycling. In addition, the Laurens County Landfill Recycling & Disposal Site accepts farmer oil (e.g., oil from farm machinery) – up to 55 gallons – as well as oil/gasoline mixtures.

The following petroleum products **ARE ACCEPTED** and may be put into any used oil collection tank: motor oil; hydraulic fluid; gear oil; diesel fuel; fuel oil; kerosene; automatic transmission fluid; and power steering fluid.

The following petroleum products **CANNOT BE PLACED** in the used oil collection tanks: antifreeze; Varsol; brake fluid; paint (oil and latex); paint thinner; refrigeration oil; and any solvent cleaner or substance used to clean paint brushes.

Why is recycling important?

- Recycling prevents materials from going into a landfill.
- Recycling saves money and creates jobs.
- Recycling saves natural resources like trees and petroleum.

How should items be prepared for recycling?

- Separate recyclables from your household trash.
- Rinse bottles, cans and jars.
- Flatten cardboard, aluminum cans, plastic bottles and steel cans. This will help save space.
- Keep newspaper and magazines clean and dry.
- At the recycling centers, place recyclables in the correct containers.
- When in doubt, ask!

Accepted Waste for Disposal

Types of waste accepted at centers for disposal include: daily household garbage; toys; furniture; bedding; mattresses and box springs; carpet (up to one standard room size **ONLY**); and **DRY, EMPTY** paint cans.

Prohibited Waste

The following waste is prohibited from disposal at all centers. **Violators are subject to fines up to \$1,000 per violation.** Please call **(864) 682-2415** or **(864) 984-6821** for more information. Prohibited waste includes:

- commercial, industrial, agricultural, contractual or any type of waste collected or transported for compensation;
- construction, demolition and building material debris;
- land-clearing debris (e.g., trees, tree stumps), yard trimmings (e.g., leaves, limbs, and shrubbery), garden soil or dirt;
- burned material and ashes;
- dead animals; and
- appliances, metals, auto parts, liquids, sludge and bulk loads.



* **It's now the law to recycle electronics in South Carolina.** S.C. residents may not knowingly place or discard a computer, computer monitor, printer or television in any waste stream that is to be disposed of in a solid waste landfill. Unwanted electronics (e-scrap) accepted from residents for recycling include: PCs; monitors; VCRs; radios; stereos; DVD players; microwaves; power supplies; rechargeable batteries; vacuums; banking equipment; telephones; pagers; networking equipment; laptops; keyboards; mice; power cables; medical equipment (non-hazardous); printers; copy machines; fax machines; cell phones; transformers; scanners; portable electronic devices; servers; HUBS; ink cartridges; toner cartridges; remotes; modems; projectors; and cameras. **NOTE: E-scrap is accepted from households ONLY.** For e-scrap recycling options for schools and businesses, call **(864) 682-2415**. In addition to all Laurens County Recycling Centers, e-scrap is accepted by many manufacturers and retailers that also offer consumer takeback programs.
