Suicides Among Older Adults in South Carolina

Suicide in older adults (65 years old and over) is a major public health issue. Nationally, older adults make up 12% of the population but account for 18% of all suicide deaths.

This is a growing concern given the number of Americans ages 65 and older is projected to nearly double in 40 years.²

In 2018, there were 146 suicide deaths among those aged 65 years and older. The rate of suicide deaths among older adults has remained relatively constant over the last 10 years.

Suicide Deaths Among Those Aged 65 Years and Older Rate per 100,000 population



adults over the age of 65 died by suicide in South Carolina from 2014-2018.

Men in the 85+ year age group had the highest rate of suicide deaths, while women in the 65-74 year age group had the highest rate of suicide deaths among older adult women.

81.7% are males



Most older adult suicide deaths were among males (81.7%), while most emergency department (ED) visits and hospitalizations were among females (53%).

The rate of suicide deaths was 8 times higher

for non-Hispanic White older adults than non-Hispanic Black older adults.


Older Adult Suicide Deaths Rates, by Race/Ethnicity Rate per 100,000 population





Incident Characteristics of Older Adult Suicide





Firearms were the most common weapon used in older adult suicides, accounting for **78.3%** of older adult suicide deaths and over two-thirds of male suicides.




SC VDRS, Ages 65+, 2014-2018 Note: Suicide intent disclosed within 1 month prior to fatal injury.


Of all suicide victims who disclosed intent, 73 reached out to a previous or current intimate partner.

Mental Health and Substance Use Comparison by Age Group




A current mental health problem was found to be the highest in both the youth and older adult age groups. The prevalence of history of mental health treatment was 3 times higher in the younger age group compared to the older age group.

Physical health

problem was the leading circumstance for older adult suicides, found in 63% of suicides and the most common circumstance among older adult men.


Circumstances Preceding Suicides, by Sex



Nonfatal Older Adult Suicide ED Visits & Hospitalizations


Nonfatal Older Adult Suicide Emergency Department Visits, by Age Group

112 older adults aged 65 years and older visited the emergency department (ED) and 133 were hospitalized for nonfatal suicide in 2019.

Older adults ages **65-74 years** had the highest rate for both ED visits and hospitalizations for nonfatal suicide.

Total charges for attempted suicide among those 65+ years in South Carolina totaled nearly 8 million in emergency department visits and hospitalizations in 2019.

Data Considerations/SC VDRS Limitations

The SC Violent Death Reporting System (SC VDRS) combines data from various sources to identify known stressors and events that have contributed to elderly suicides in our state.

- SC VDRS data includes all elderly who fatally injured themselves within South Carolina whether they were South
 Carolina residents or not. South Carolina resident seniors who fatally injured themselves outside of South Carolina
 are not included in this report.
- Known circumstances leading to the suicide event are subject to the knowledge of family members, friends, and others who report to coroners and law enforcement during investigations.
- Those 65+ years who died by suicide may differ by demographic profile, circumstances, or use of methods from those 65+ years who survived a suicide attempt.
