HOMICIDE AND ASSAULT AT A GLANCE



In the United States, SC ranks
7th highest in homicides, and
6th highest in rate of
homicides that are caused by
firearms.



The South Carolina homicide rate has increased by 34% in the past 10 years.



Black males ages 18 to 24 in SC have the highest rates of death by homicide.



An argument is the most common circumstance in triggering homicides, among males.



The most common mechanism for homicide was firearm.

THE IMPACT OF HOMICIDES AND ASSAULT INJURIES



Each day in South Carolina, one person dies from a homicide, 41 visit the Emergency Department (ED) for assault-related injuries, and three are admitted to the hospital for assault-related injuries.



Hospital and ED charges for assault-related injuries in 2018 included:


- \$94 million in hospital inpatient charges and
- \$82 million in ED charges.



Homicide Deaths by Age (2014-2018)






Counties with Highest Homicide Rates (2014-2018)
